Sunday Nursery Needs Volunteers to Stay Open

We would very much like to keep providing safe child care for children ages 1-5 so their parents, and others sitting nearby, can give their full attention to Sunday Mass.

To ensure a safe environment for our precious children requires that two properly screened adults be on duty in the Nursery. We have one paid employee and a few great volunteers already, but they do have other commitments and vacations. Could you volunteer in the Nursery during even just one 8:30 or 10:30 Mass a month? Without sufficient volunteers, we will have to be closed during some Masses.

The Diocesan Safe Environment Program mandates background checks of volunteers who work with children, and it takes at least a couple of weeks to process these screenings. If you have already been screened as a high-responsibility volunteer for another ministry, please consider our urgent need for volunteers to work in the Nursery. If you have not yet been screened, we would love to have you come get an application ASAP so we can get it processed and you can start.
