REPORTING ABUSE/NEGLECT OF THE SICK AND ELDERLY

A person who reasonably believes that an elderly or sick adult is the victim of physical, emotional or financial abuse or neglect should call 9-1-1 if the person is in imminent danger. Whether or not 9-1-1 is called, the witness to the abuse or neglect should call Adult Protective Services at 1-877-767-2385. In addition, please notify the parish Compliance Officers through the parish office. Persons making reports do not have to prove the abuse/neglect and are exempt from liability as long as they are acting in good faith and not maliciously. Investigation and validation of a report is the responsibility of the Department of Adult Protective Services.
