THE HOPE AND PROMISE OF REDEMPTION

The prophet Jeremiah prophesies the end of the Babylonian exile. He describes how the weak and sorrowful people now return with joy. These are the scattered people of God: the blind and the lame, the mothers and pregnant women. They shall be led along an easy road so that no one will stum-

ble. The Lord's kindness and mercy are on all these weak and broken people.

Here and in Psalm 126 we find the most lovely poetic images of God's love and care for us. "Those that sow in tears / shall reap rejoicing. Although they go forth weeping, / carrying the seed to be sown, / they shall come back rejoicing, / carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5–6). Although God had to punish Israel for their many sins, God never forgot them, scattered as they were, and brings them all back to the land of their ancestors, there to flourish and be joyful again. 

CATHOLIC MEN'S CONFERENCE



Catholic Community Services Needs Supplies for Asylum Seekers

Catholic Community Services is coordinating temporary housing for hundreds of asylum seekers. Most are women and children from Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador. Immigration and Customs Enforcement knows about these people who have been released from their custody, so helping them with basic needs while they wait for asylum proceedings is not illegal. Because the Greyhound bus station is operating at half capacity, traveling to various destination cities has been delayed. Stranded travelers need the following items: backpacks or totes, jackets and sweaters and long pants for women in small and medium sizes and for men in small sizes, women's socks and closed-toed shoes, underwear for men, women and children, travel blankets (buses can be freezing), and food for traveling such as granola bars, juice boxes, snack packs of tuna or cheese & crackers, etc. Please bring donated items Monday through Friday only, between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., to Catholic Community Services, 140 W. Speedway, Suite 130. The number for Catholic Community Services is (520) 623-0344.
