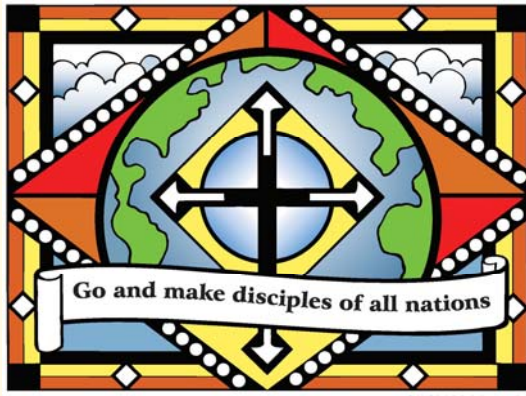

“PUSHED” OUT ON MISSION

There is a delightful character in the original *Dr. Dolittle Tales* called the “Pushmi-Pullyu.” It is a beast with two identical halves,

with a head at each end. No matter which direction the beast walks, one end is the “push me” and the other is the “pull you.” Today’s feast is a bit like that in the life of the church. In the book of the Acts of the Apostles, it is the ascension of Christ that calls for the Holy Spirit, which consequently sends or “pushes” the church out on its mission. This is the message that we hear from the angels today as they tell the friends of Jesus not to look up into the clouds, but to get busy. It is the message of Jesus himself in Matthew’s Gospel, as he sends them out to baptize. He also tells them, “I am with you always, until the end of the age” (Matthew 28:20). And it is this message, confident in faith that Jesus has ascended to shouts of joy, that “pulls” us along to our final destiny. The life of the faithful disciple, sent into the world on mission, will one day know the same risen, ascended glory.

NEWS

Our bishop has not yet authorized a general, full re-opening of all parishes. However, gradual plans are in the works. Check www.diocetucson.org for ongoing news.

Although we do not yet think it safe to hold Masses or any other group gatherings indoors, starting the weekend of May 23-24 there will be distribution of Holy Communion in the west parking lot of St. Frances Cabrini Church at the following times: 5:00 to 5:30 p.m. on Saturday, and 8:30 to 9:00 and 10:00 to 10:30 a.m. on Sunday. We ask that everyone please wear masks, stay in your vehicles, and follow the signs for traffic flow. As you drive beside where he is standing, our pastor, Fr. Jay, who will be wearing mask and gloves, will reach through your open window and hand you the number of consecrated hosts required for the people in your car who wish to receive it.

A parish member with a collection basket, in mask and gloves, will be standing some distance from Fr. Jay to receive offering envelopes people may wish to bring. Please do not get out of your vehicle; hand the envelope to him or her through your window.

Fr. Jay has been sending weekly letters to all parish members for whom we have email addresses. If we don’t have your email address and you would like to receive these letters, please email us at cabrinil962@aol.com. When we are ready to further expand services at our parish, he will let you know in an upcoming letter, and we will also put the information in the bulletin, which we post on our parish website.

If you know someone who does not have Internet access and who might like to be mailed paper copies of Fr. Jay’s letters and/or our bulletins, ask them to call the office (326-7670) and let us know.

There is a Catholic Mass on Sundays on at 7:30 a.m. on KWBA, Channel 58.1 and Channel 58 on DirecTV and Dish Network. Cox Contour and Comcast Xfinity cable providers have it on Channel 8 at 7:30 a.m. on Sundays. Cox Cable has Catholic TV Channel 113, which has Masses and other devotions that you may access at any time.
