NEWS

Out of concern for our safety, our bishop has not yet authorized a general and total re-opening of all parishes. Check www.diocesetucson.org, the website of the Diocese of Tucson, for ongoing news.

Due to the large number of members of our parish who are senior citizens (including our pastor and most of our liturgical ministers), many of whom have underlying health conditions, we need to put a lot of thought into carefully planning our gatherings. Some parishes will open sooner than we do. We are in the process of working out the logistics of having Masses and other gatherings here in the safest possible manner while the rate of new infections and death rate from COVID-19 continues to rise in our state.

Although we do not yet think it safe to hold Masses or any other large group gatherings indoors, starting the weekend of May 23-24, with the bishop's approval, we began the practice of distribution of Holy Communion in the west parking lot of St. Frances Cabrini Church at the following times: 5:00 to 5:20 p.m. on Saturday, and 8:30 to 8:50 and 10:00 to 10:20 a.m. on Sunday. This will happen each weekend until further notice.

We ask that everyone please wear masks, stay in your vehicles, and follow the signs for traffic flow. As you drive beside where he is standing, near the northwest church entrance, Fr. Jay or one of the Eucharistic Ministers, wearing mask and gloves, will reach through your open window and hand you the number of consecrated hosts required for the people in your car who wish to receive it.

A parish member with a collection basket, in mask and gloves, will be standing on the way to the designated exit to receive any offering envelopes people may wish to bring. Please do not get out of your vehicle; put the envelope in the basket through your window.

Fr. Jay has been sending weekly letters to all parish members for whom we have email addresses. When we are ready to further expand services at our parish, he will let you know in an upcoming letter, and we will also put the information in the bulletin, which we post on our parish website. If we don't have your email address and you would like to receive these letters by email, please contact us at cabrini1962@aol.com.

SR. JOSE WOMEN'S SHELTER SLOWLY REOPENS

Sr. Jose Women's Shelter in Tucson, one of the programs of our diocese, has been challenged in its efforts to continue serving vulnerable homeless women during the COVID-19 crisis. Before the pandemic, they served between 100-125 women every day with food, showers, toiletries and a change of clothing, if needed. They had some beds for women to stay overnight.

The pandemic forced the Center to close its doors. The decision was made to quarantine the 30 women who were then sleeping there for 2 weeks and not allow new clients to come inside. Barriers were made along the floor every 10 feet to insure that the women already there could remain distant from one another. Not one contracted the virus!

Following the 2-weeek quarantine, most of the women who sheltered in place there have left. Once the few who remain have all found other accommodations, the shelter will close overnight services until new construction can remodel and expand the facilities. At the end of May, the shelter began to let women in one at a time, first checking their temperature, to shower and receive a change of clothing. Staff and volunteers are providing food and other needed items from their front doors, safely and at a distance.
