#### GOD REVEALED TO THE NATIONS

What wonderful images we have
today of the reign
of God! Isaiah
speaks to us of a
great feast—a
heavenly feast—a
feast of abundance
with rich foods and
choice wines. It is



the Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace.

Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son. This is a feast of abundance also, with the fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there. And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us.

5:00 p.m. Sat. — Drive-Through Communion Distribution in West Parking Lot (recommended for those who must avoid indoor public gatherings or who wish to do so, or those who cannot wear a mask)— Fr. Jay Jensen

10:30 Sun. — Mass (recommended for those 65 and older, to avoid contact with younger persons, who are more likely to be asymptomatic if they have the COVID-19 virus) — Fr. Martin Barnum

#### Coming to Mass:

In this phase of re-opening, we are trying to minimize physical contact to avoid spreading the COVID -19 virus, in case anyone in our congregation has it without showing symptoms. (If you do feel ill, please stay home and call your doctor!) Please wear a mask. Please allow a Hospitality Minister to find you a seat, so that we can have proper physical distancing. Holy Communion will be distributed by Eucharistic Ministers from rows that will be intentionally left unoccupied between rows where people will be seated. Baskets for contributions will be at the two open exits, to avoid passing them.

Confessions: To arrange for the Sacrament of Penance (Confession), call the parish office. Fr. Jay will take appointments for Confession on Thursday mornings between 9:00 and noon and on Fridays from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.

#### October 15th Feast Day of St. Teresa of Jesus

Also known as St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582), she was a Spanish noblewoman who became a Carmelite nun. She is known for her reformation of the Carmelite orders of both women and men in the direction of stricter observance of poverty and spiritual practices, her profound devotion to Jesus and her mysticism. She wrote several influential books, was canonized in 1622, and was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1970 in recognition of her spiritual legacy to Catholicism.

This is a translation of one of her most famous poems: *Let nothing disturb you.* 

Let nothing make you afraid.

All things are passing.

God alone never changes.

Patience gains all things.

If you have God you will want for nothing.

God alone suffices.

You may recognize the words from a Taize hymn we have sung in our parish church, "Nada Te Turbe/Let Nothing Disturb You." The words of the hymn are adapted from this poem.
