

## THE WATERS **OF BAPTISM**

When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this "knits" the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is



the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times and cultures have used it so prominently. When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he "knit" himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary's womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. ## Our Current Schedule of Services:

In a letter of 12/10/20, written in response to the recent surge of COVID-19 cases in the state of Arizona, Bishop Weisenburger "urges those over the age of 65 or with any health concerns to please refrain from inperson participation in our parishes." Our Bishop believes that, for their safety, priests and everyone else over 65 or with health concerns should not go to public Masses.

In our parish, since both Fr. Jay and Fr. Marty are over 65 and Fr. Jay has pre-existing health concerns, and, moreover, almost all of our liturgical ministers are over 65, along with a large percentage of our congregation, we are, most reluctantly, suspending Masses in our church, for the time being. When pandemic conditions allow us to ease restrictions and have Masses again, we will let you know in this bulletin and in Fr. Jay's weekly emailed letters to all parishioners for whom we have email addresses.

For now, our only Services will be the 5:00 p.m. Saturday evening drive-through Distribution of Holy Communion in the west parking lot of the church. We ask that you now please enter the parking lot from the entrance closest to the Rectory on Presidio Rd., drive behind the Hall and Education Building, and from there to the northwest entrance of the church. If you roll down your window (please wear a mask if this is possible for you), Fr. Jay or another Eucharistic Minister, wearing a protective mask and gloves, will hand you the blessed hosts for as many people as are in your vehicle. On the way out through the marked exit, a volunteer will also have a basket for financial contributions. The first Sat. of each month he will also have the blue barrel for St. Vincent de Paul items.
