


A NEW DAY DAWNS

<u>Our Current Services</u> Edward Weisenburger, the Bishop of our Diocese, recently informed all priests that they were to close parish office

ly informed all priests that they were to close parish offices to the public and suspend all public indoor Masses until at least Feb. 1, at which point he will re-evaluate his decision. This decision was made to protect us all from the spread of COVID-19, since rates of infection, hospitalization and deaths from the virus are higher than ever before. When pandemic conditions allow us to ease restrictions and have Masses and have the office open again on a less restrictive basis, we will let you know in this bulletin and in Fr. Jay's weekly emailed letters to all parishioners for whom we have email addresses. In addition to posting them on the parish website, we also send Father's letters and this bulletin by regular mail to those who request them. Call (520) 326-7670.

Our parish will continue to have the <u>Saturday evening</u> <u>drive-through distribution of Holy Communion</u> in the west parking lot of the church. This takes place from <u>5:00 p.m.</u> to approximately 5:20 p.m.

We ask that you enter the parking lot from the entrance closest to the Rectory on Presidio Rd., drive behind the Hall and Education Building, and from there to the northwest entrance of the church. If you roll down your window (please wear a mask if this is possible for you), Fr. Jay or another Eucharistic Minister, wearing a protective mask , will hand you the blessed hosts for as many people as are in your vehicle. On the way out through the marked exit, a volunteer will also have a basket for financial contributions. The first Sat. of each month we will also have the blue barrel for St. Vincent de Paul items available.

If you need something from the office, please call ahead on a weekday to make sure someone is in the office. We will make arrangements to meet you, masked, at the door to assist you. We will be unable to invite you inside.

DO YOU KNOW THIS SAINT?

Saint Angela Merici was born March 21, 1474 and died Jan. 27, 1540; Jan. 27 is her feast day. St. Angela was born on a farm in Lombardy, Italy. Known for her devotion to God and the saints, she joined the Third Order of St. Francis as a young woman. Then she had a vision that she was to found an association of women who would devote themselves to the religious education of girls. She founded the Company of St. Ursula, which after her death became the Order of Ursulines, the first teaching order of women religious. She was canonized in 1807.
