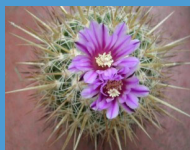

St. Frances Cabrini, born in Italy in 1850, founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She immigrated to New York in 1887 to assist Catholic immigrants, died in 1917 and was the first American citizen to be canonized.

HOLY WEEK

For the Palm Sunday Gospel, we return to the Gospel according to Mark. The account of the Passion takes up nearly one-third of Mark's entire Gospel and, of all the evangelists, he is the one who presents the details most graphically. He depicts the humanity of Jesus most intensely, describing his sufferings thoroughly. Mark portrays Jesus as a complete fulfillment of the "Suffering Servant" of Isaiah, the obedient, humble slave dying on a cross of whom Paul speaks in Philippians. But it is important to remember that we call this "Holy Week" and not "sad week" or "suffering week," for each of the readings today, even the lamentations of the psalm, end in the promise of the strength and hope that is granted by God to those who faithfully give of themselves in love. As we enter into this week through these readings, we must reflect deeply on the sufferings of Jesus, but still be confident in the joy of risen, eternal life that awaits all of us who faithfully walk with him through these days. Note: While the Paschal Candle will be lighted, individual candles will not be distributed to the congregation.

Per diocesan protocols, given the size of our church, attendance at indoor services is limited to 70 persons, to have social distancing. Masks are still required. We will not pass collection baskets during Masses, but will have them at the west doors of the church at the end of each Mass.

Fr. Jay Jensen will preside at the Drive-Through Distribution of Holy Eucharist on March 27, the Holy Thursday Mass, the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday, and the Drive-Through Distribution of Holy Eucharist on Easter Sunday. Fr. Martin Barnum will preside at both Masses on Palm Sunday, the Good Friday Service, and both Masses on Easter Sunday. Deacon Charles Gallegos will assist on Good Friday and at the Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday Masses.

Donating Easter Flowers:

If you would like to donate a suitable flowering plant (such as lilies, tulips, or hyacinths) to decorate our church for Easter, please bring it to the Parish Office between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 31st or between 10:00 a.m. and noon on Thursday, April 1st. Please ring the doorbell and place your plant(s) on the brick planter wall that is just next to the front door. Someone wearing a mask will come out to greet and thank you and pick up the plant!

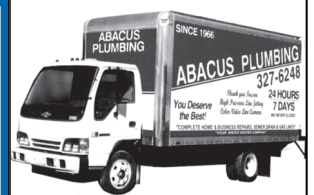
