#### PAYING THE PRICE

In the first reading, Ezekiel struggles with the job he is given by the Lord, speaking to a rebellious people. In the second reading, Paul is dealing with a "thorn in his side," that is, the difficulties of his own personal weakness and foibles, and learning to rely on God's grace. Mark's Gospel introduces us



to a Jesus who is struggling to be believed and accepted in his native country. In all three passages, the major figures are following the will of God and paying the price of rejection by the community for their efforts.

There are times when being Catholic, or even being Christian, is very countercultural. It used to be you belonged to a parish, and that was your home, based on your geographic boundaries or ethnicity. But now people change parishes depending on pastors, styles of music, or the Mass schedule. In these days of COVID-19, many who stayed away because of social distancing have not yet found their way back. Many never recovered from their disillusionment over the abuse scandals. Others left Catholicism for non-denominational churches, or explored other paths such as Buddhism. Still others consider themselves "spiritual but not religious" or are labeled "nones." Frequently, families who once sat together every week in church are now scattered all over the spiritual spectrum. In the face of all this, let us pray for the strength of Ezekiel to continue to preach our faith by the lives we live, despite everything in our culture that rebels against religion. May we have the wisdom of Paul to persevere despite our weaknesses and the thorns in our side. And like Jesus, may we always find the faith we need to endure, even when those around us do not. Please note that protocols are different at the Saturday and Sunday Masses.

At the <u>5:00 Saturday Mass</u>, we will continue to require face masks and social distancing of at least six feet for those not of the same household. Therefore, this Mass is suitable for those who are not yet fully vaccinated and/or those who wish to continue to observe these safety precautions for any other reasons. The Bishop has asked all parishes to have one Mass where safety precautions are still observed. Therefore, if you come to this Mass, <u>please</u> do not make other people uncomfortable by refusing to follow the protocols for this Mass. You will not be asked to follow these precautions at the other two Masses.

Those who are fully vaccinated and wish to attend one of the <u>two Sunday Masses</u> will no longer be required to wear face masks or observe the six-foot social distancing requirement. You can sit now next to your friends! If you will feel more comfortable continuing to wear a mask at Sunday Mass, however, you are welcome to do so.

Holy Communion will be distributed at the traditional time at all Masses and will be the Body of Christ only, received in the hand only. The Eucharistic Ministers will distribute it from the rows with yellow caution tape on the seats. These are every other row of seats in the church. Please do not sit in these seats at any of the Masses.

By offering these different ways to attend Mass, we hope to serve as many people as possible.



## FR. JAY HAS RETIRED NEW PARISH ADMINISTRATOR NAMED

Fr. Jay, who turned 70 in April, retired as of June 30, 2021. Bishop Weisenburger has appointed a new parish administrator for St. Frances Cabrini Parish, effective July 1st. He is Fr. Balaswamy ("Fr. Bala") Kommathoti, who has been one of the associate pastors at Sts. Peter and Paul parish and will continue to be in residence there. The Bishop's letter of May 18, posted on the website, explains a possible plan for our parish at some future time yet to be determined. Fr. Bala will be responsible for general pastoral care, Masses, and parish administration until a permanent future plan is established for the parish.
