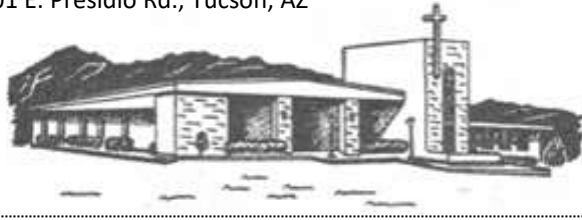

will be wailing and grinding of

teeth.'"
