Did you know that your cash donations to SVDP may qualify you for a tax credit on your AZ State Income Tax Return? The Arizona Qualified Charitable Organi-



zation tax credit provides for a dollar-for-dollar reduction on your tax liability: up to \$421 for a single person; \$841 on a joint return. And your donation does not have to be made in a lump sum.
