In the Gospel, Jesus refers to a bronze serpent mounted on a pole by Moses to heal people bitten by snakes in the desert. That passage is in Numbers 21: 4-9. There is a symbolic parallel with Jesus, who heals us through his cross.

All are welcome to a free concert, "O Lux Beata, Vespers Honoring Padre Kino," featuring Carlos Zapien and members of the Cathedral Schola, on Sunday, March 17 at 2:00 p.m. The concert will be held at St. Andrew the Apostle Roman Catholic Church, 800 Taylor Drive, in Sierra Vista, AZ. Carlos will direct a performance of several of his original works that were commissioned by the Kino Heritage Society. There is no admission charge, but a freewill offering will be accepted. Venerable Eusebio Francisco Kino is in the process of being canonized as a saint by the Catholic Church. He was a missionary of the Jesuit order who traveled over 50,000 miles on horseback throughout the Sonoran desert area (in what are now the states of Arizona and New Mexico in the U.S.A. and Sonora in Mexico), founding 21 missions as he evangelized the native peoples in the 17th century. As he saved souls, he also sought to protect his flock from mistreatment by the Spanish government and exploitation by wealthy landowners.
