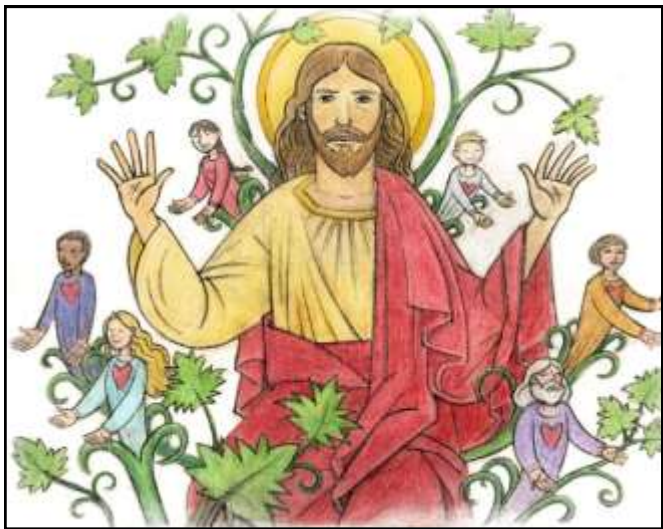

### THIS WEEKEND — PARISH CRAWFISH FESTIVAL!

Our parish is holding its annual Crawfish Festival, a Vietnamese-Cajun- American tradition, April 26-28. Festival hours are Friday the 26th, 5:00 to 10:00 p.m.; Sat. the 27th, 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., and Sun. the 28th, 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Cajun boiled crawfish and shrimp will be sold, along with other Vietnamese foods, beer, sodas and boba teas. A karaoke contest will be held Friday night from 7:00 to 10:00. The Tinh Xanh band will entertain Sat. night from 7:00 to 10:00. Overall Admission is free.

Vietnamese foods and beverages will be sold on all days of the festival, although there will be a more limited selection on Friday, because most people who prepare the food work on Fridays. The Cajun boiled crawfish and shrimp, sold in the shell and by the pound, sells out early, so Friday and Saturday are the best days to get them.
