#### MEMORIAL DAY MASS AT HOLY HOPE

Bishop Edward Weisenburger will preside at a special Memorial Day Mass at the Mausoleum in Holy Hope Cemetery at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, May 27th. Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, was first officially celebrated in May of 1868 at Arlington National Cemetery. It was a time to honor Union soldiers who died in the Civil War by decorating their graves and remembering their service in public tributes. The annual event has continued in honor of all those who died in service to our country in the wars and conflicts which have followed. President Lyndon B. Johnson officially changed the name to Memorial Day in 1966. Memorial Day now honors all deceased military members who have served our country in peacetime as well as times of armed conflict.
