

TO ALL WHO WISH TO ATTEND OCIA/RCIA CLASSES

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (it was called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults until Nov. 2021) is a process for non-Catholic adults to learn more about the Catholic Church and join the Catholic faith if they so decide; it is also for baptized Catholics who have not yet received their First Confession, First Communion, and/or Confirmation. If you wish to become a Catholic, or to receive any Sacraments that you have not yet received, or to be baptized into the Catholic Church as an adult, contact Deacon Charles Gallegos of this parish. Classes will begin in late August and will continue each Thursday evening until Easter, when our Bishop Weisenburger will confer the Sacraments on all catechumens and candidates.
