OCIA/RCIA CLASSES TO START SEPT. 12

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a process for non-Catholic adults to learn more about the Catholic Church and join the Catholic faith; it is also for baptized Catholics who have not yet received their First Confession, First Communion, and/or Confirmation. If you wish to become a Catholic, or to receive any Sacraments that you have not yet received, or to be baptized into the Catholic Church as an adult, contact Deacon Charles Gallegos of this parish. Classes will begin Sept. 12 and will continue each Thursday evening, 7:00 to 8:30 p.m., until Easter, when Bishop Weisenburger will confer the Sacraments. Classes will be in English and are for those 18 years of age or older. The cost is \$50 for materials, but there is financial assistance for those who qualify. 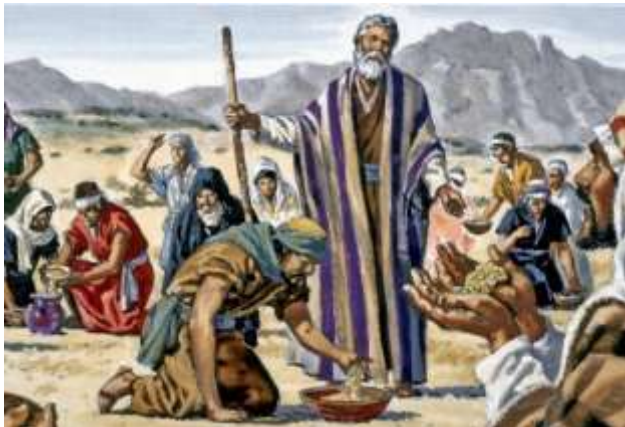

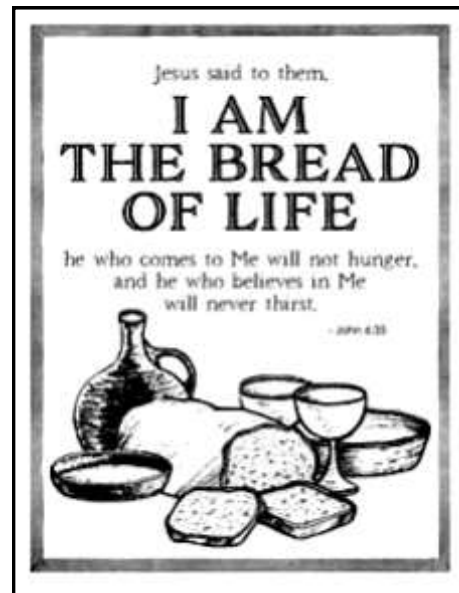

Today's first Reading is from the Book of Exodus, a passage in which God sends manna, or bread from heaven, to feed the starving Israelites in the desert. In today's Gospel, Jesus and some members of the crowd he just fed (described in last Sunday's Gospel) talk about bread from heaven; Jesus wants them to think about food for the soul, which gives eternal life, and tells them that he is that true bread from heaven.
