AZ QUALIFIED CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION TAX CREDIT —SVdeP

Your checks and cash contributions made to our parish SVdeP qualify for a tax credit on your AZ Tax Return. The AQCO Tax Credit provides a dollar for dollar reduction on your tax liability for up to \$470 for a single person and up to \$938 on a joint return. Your donation does not have to be made in a lump sum. It can be made in smaller amounts throughout the year (even donations you make Jan.-April, 2025 qualify). The credit is claimed on [AZ Tax Form 321](#).

For contributions made prior to October 1, 2024, use

Code 20768. Contributions made after that date

should be reported using Code 20203. Questions?
