AZ QUALIFIED CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION TAX CREDIT —SVdeP

Your checks and cash contributions made to our parish SVdeP qualify for a tax credit on your AZ Tax Return. The AQCO Tax Credit provides a dollar for dollar reduction on your tax liability for up to \$470 for a single person and up to \$938 on a joint return. Your donation does not have to be made in a lump sum. It can be made in smaller amounts throughout the year (even donations you make Jan.-April, 2025 qualify). The credit is claimed on AZ Tax Form 321.

For contributions made prior to October 1, 2024, use Code 20768. Contributions made after that date should be reported using Code 20203. Questions? Call Terry @559-930-2464.

First Reading Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

that he was raised on the third day
in accordance with the Scriptures;
that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve.

After that, he appeared to more
than five hundred brothers at once,
most of whom are still living,
though some have fallen asleep.
After that he appeared to James,
then to all the apostles.

Last of all, as to one abnormally born,
he appeared to me.

Therefore, whether it be I or they,
so we preach and so you believed.



Gospel Luke 5:1-11

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening
to the word of God,

he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret.

He saw two boats there alongside the lake;
the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets.

Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon,
he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore.
Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon,

Simon said in reply,

"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing,
but at your command I will lower the nets."
