The AQCO Tax Credit provides a dollar for dollar reduction on your tax liability for up to \$470 for a single person and up to \$938 on a joint return. Your donation does not have to be made in a lump sum. It can be made in smaller amounts throughout the year (even donations you make Jan.-April, 2025 qualify). The credit is claimed on [AZ Tax Form 321](#). **For contributions made prior to October 1, 2024, use Code 20768. Contributions made after that date should be reported using Code 20203.** Questions? Gospel for the Blessing of the Palms Luke 19:28-40
