REGULAR COLLECTION REPORT

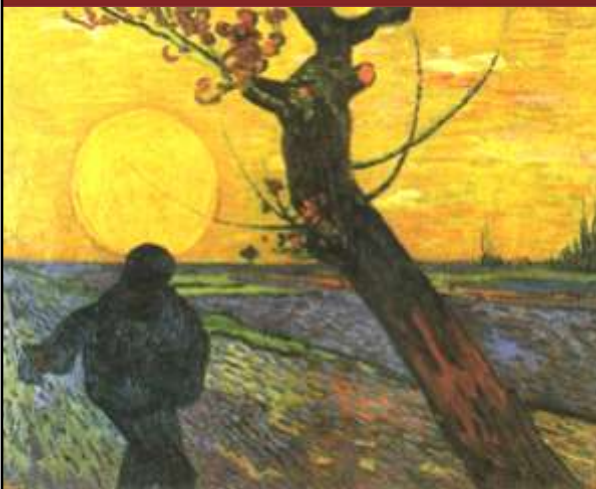
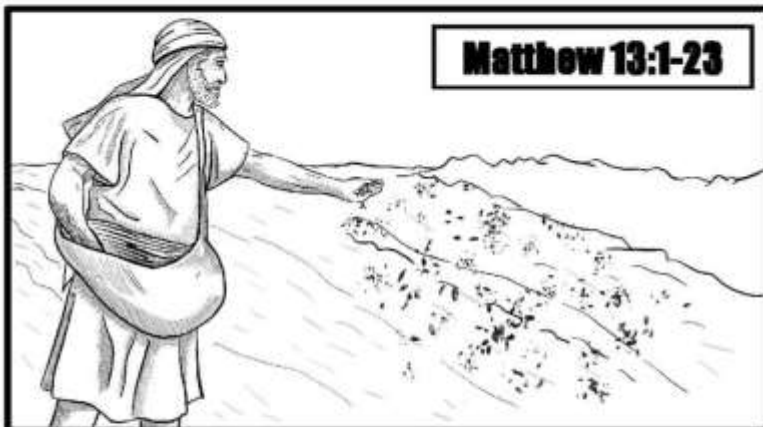
The collection total for July 4-5, 2026 is \$2,804. Thank you for your contributions to help support our parish.

The complete Readings for today, on which celebrate the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, may be found on pages 178-180 of the Breaking Bread missals. Today's Gospel Reading includes the parable of the sower and the seed. Jesus explains that the seed in the parable refers to the word of God, and the different kinds of soil onto which it falls stands for the different kinds of human hearts. Jesus and his disciples sow the seeds, but some hearts are too stony for anything to grow in them, and the thorns of "worldly anxiety and the lure of riches," as the Gospel says, can prevent other hearts from bearing a rich harvest.
