SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

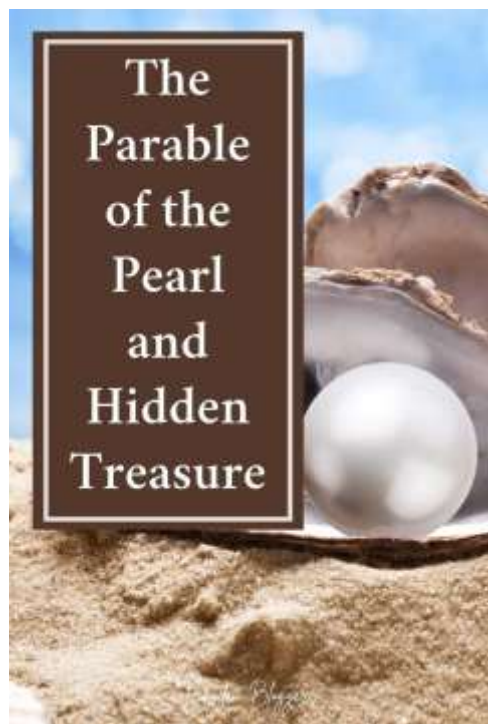
