CHURCH UNDER RENOVATION; FUNDS NEEDED

At long last, after many planning delays, the renovation of our church building has begun. **All Masses will be held in the Parish Hall** until the completion of the renovation; it will probably take at least until June. A new main entrance and vestibule, plus restrooms, will be added to the west side of the building. The beautiful stained glass windows on the west side will be saved but differently placed. There will be space within the vestibule where parents can take crying babies, and we will also have a new sacristy, and another small room where altar servers can change. There will be an outdoor statue of Our Lady of La Vang at the far west side of the parking lot, facing the new entrance. There will also be changes to the south side of the church. The flooring in the entire church will be replaced and the inside of the church will be repainted. A sprinkling system in case of fire will be installed. The altar, the choir area, and almost everything else will be put back in the same places. We all look forward to seeing the results.

Money in the parish savings account has allowed us to start the project, but prices of everything have gone up since it was first envisioned, so additional money is needed. The complete Readings for today, on which we celebrate the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, may be found on pages 196-198 of the Breaking Bread missals. In today's Gospel, Matthew 16:21-27, Jesus reveals to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem, suffer greatly and die, and will then be raised. Peter expresses a fervent wish that all this will not happen, at which point Jesus says "Get thee behind me, Satan!" and adds that Peter is not thinking as God does, but as a human being. To be a disciple of Jesus, as we are all called to become, requires self-denial, embracing one's cross, but at the last judgement God will repay each person according to their conduct.
